If ordered to pay both alimony and child support, include alimony information on the same Notice to Withhold Income form to be provided to your employer and a copy to be filed with the Clerk of the District Court (Alimony will be paid through the Nebraska Child Support Payment Center)	
If ordered to pay alimony only , provide the original Notice to Withhold Income form to your employer and file a copy of the form with the Clerk of the District Court. (Alimony will be paid through the Clerk of the District Court.) If you are entitled to child support abatements for periods of parenting time in excess of four consecutive weeks, make several copies of the affidavit form provided by your attorney for future use or prepare your own form on your computer. Keep a copy of the relevant section of your Decree and write down the address of the Clerk of the District Court to keep with it so you have it when you need it.	
Child Care and Uninqueed Medical Evnences	
<u>Child Care and Uninsured Medical Expenses</u> Set up a tracking and filing system to keep full and complete records regarding these financial matters, you may use the forms provided by your attorney	
Tax Matters	
Notify your employer of the change in your exemption status (complete a new W-4) If necessary, complete IRS Form 8822 for change of address and notify the state tax department as well.

Ongoing Responsibility to Provide Information	
If you have been ordered to pay any type of spousal or child support, you have an ongoing responsibility to notify the Court of:	
Your name and addressYour employer	
 Whether you have access to employer sponsored health insurance. When you have changes in the above information, inform the Clerk of the District Court in writing. Please use the form provided by the law firm for your convenience. (This does not need to be prepared by an attorney.) 	
Attorney Fees Contact the firm's account manager to make payment arrangements for any fees owed to the firm.	
If your former spouse was ordered to pay a portion of your attorney fees, note that you remain responsible for the payment of your attorney fees, including any applicable interest, until the account is paid.	
If you have been ordered to pay fees to your former spouse's attorney, make payment through the Clerk of the District Court, pursuant to the Decree. If you cannot make the payment on time, contact that attorney's office to try to arrange alternate payment plans.	
Estate Planning	
Review your will and any powers of attorney for any needed changes Schedule appointment with your attorney to update or prepare your will, powers of attorney and other important estate planning documents
